About the Philippine Institute of **Environmental Planners (PIEP)**

The Philippine Institute of Environmental Planners (PIEP) is the national professional organization of all environmental/urban planners licensed by the Professional Regulation Commission.

PIEP is a nonstock, not-for-profit corporation that was formally established on 16 October 1969, with the approval of its charter by the Securities and Exchange Commission.

On 18 June 1965, Congress enacted Republic Act No. 4341, providing for the establishment of the Institute of Planning (now School of Urban and Regional Planning) as an academic unit of the University of the Philippines. After noting the increasing number of graduates produced by the Institute, PIEP was organized as a national association of professionally trained planners to advance the study of environmental planning, as well as to promote the environmental planning profession.


Administrative Notes to all Delegates

- 1. Since we are anticipating a packed Convention, we will endeavor to observe all time limits. We will promptly begin all activities at their designated times.
- 2. Registration will promptly start at 8:00 AM on 27 November 2024, and at 7:00 AM on 28, 29 November 2024.
- Delegates are provided with unique QR codes in their respective accounts on the Convention website. Log-in to your account and download the QR code to your smartphones.
- During the registration process, delegates will queue at the registration table to have their QR codes scanned.
- Beside the registration table, delegates will be given their Convention kits and ID badges.
- For issuance of official receipts and any reimbursements, kindly approach the National Secretariat.
- 3. Since the Convention is a CPD activity, attendance will be checked twice a day: first, in the morning and, second, after lunch. Kindly make sure to have your QR codes scanned at the registration table.
- 4. Seating arrangement is on a "first-come, first-served" basis each day.
- 3. The registration fee is inclusive of Convention kit, buffet lunch, and AM/PM snacks only, except for Day 2 when buffet dinner will be served during the Cultural Night/Fellowship Dinner.
